I'm Brigid and I've been volunteering at Age Concern for five years now. I live in Epsom and wanted to volunteer at a charity where I could get involved with the local community. When I joined, there was a need for admin support, and so that's where I've mostly been deployed. I've helped out on the Transport Desk and the now closed Foot Clinic; I've supported the Will Writing Service and during lockdown, I shopped for self-isolating people and then drove some to get their Covid jabs. It was such a strange time, but I think that for many people, charities like Age Concern were a real lifeline, especially for those whose families lived far away.

Also during lockdown, I had a baby boy, so I've had to cut back a bit on the volunteering, as I now have a very full time job! However, I'm still able to run the monthly lottery, which I absolutely love. There is nothing better than bringing joy to the winners with a lovely little cheque each month.

We are currently doing a drive to get more people to join our lottery. It's a win win for everyone, because 40% of the money raised goes to the winners and 60% goes towards supporting the work of our charity.

## **Volunteering Update**

### **Focus on Medical Transport Drivers**



Our medical transport service is invaluable for local people over retirement age needing to get to their medical appointments.

The service couldn't exist without our wonderful volunteers who come into the office to run the transport bookings desk and of course our team of dedicated volunteer drivers. Our drivers provide a very personal service, collecting people from home and waiting for them until their appointment is over and they are ready to return home. Many of the drives are to local hospitals and clinics but our drivers may also take people to appointments further afield, such as the big London hospitals.

We caught up with Stuart who has been a volunteer driver with us for the past 14 years. He became a volunteer after he retired when he was looking for something new to get him out of the house. Stuart's first drive was a challenge as it was snowing but he rose to the challenge and has been a dedicated volunteer ever since. Stuart told us it was his first experience of volunteering, and it has been a very positive experience for him, saying that helping others and being appreciated gives him a good feeling of wellbeing.

Stuart has had a lot of repeat customers over the years and has got to know some of them very well. He told us that customers can be quite anxious about their appointments, and being a very friendly and chatty person, he is able to take their mind off their worries during the journey so they arrive feeling a little more relaxed.

Being a Medical Transport Driver is a very rewarding and flexible role. Drivers can choose which drives they accept and can do as little or as many as they wish to fit in with their lifestyles.

## **Client Story**

We were delighted to hear that one of our clients,

Mr Jim Pickering, had recently attended an event at Buckingham Palace. It was a special occasion to mark the 70th year since the end of the Korean War.

Originally planned for 2023 the date was postponed due to the Korean president's availability and then sadly, due to health concerns, the King could not attend.

Princess Anne and Princess Sophie, hosted the event on behalf of the King.



Princess Sophie is the Colonel-in-Chief of the corps of Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers, the regiment in which Jim served. Jim was impressed by her knowledge and genuine interest. Jim recalled:

"It was wonderful to attend the palace to mark the 70th anniversary since the end of, what many of us veterans consider to be, a forgotten war. It was special to meet with both Royals and other fellow veterans".

I was delighted to be invited to meet with Jim and his wife Enid who were happy to share their stories.

Jim and Enid grew up in Warrington. In the 1950s, if you were a man between the ages of 18 – 26, it was compulsory to do 18 months of national service. As Jim was taking an apprenticeship in engineering he was able to defer for two years until, at the age of 21, he was drafted to serve in the Korean War.

I asked Jim how it felt to be called up and he replied;

"It was something you just had to get on and do. I had no desire or prior interest in joining the Army, I wanted to carve a career in engineering. I was assigned to the REME regiment, the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers. Of course, it did dawn on me, that I may be killed but as I said there was nothing that could be done so you had to just get on and do it'

I was taken aback by Jim's pragmatic response to what must have been a very challenging time at a relatively young age. Perhaps this stoicism was instilled in the postwar generation who had already lived through a world war and won. Having never travelled abroad Jim then found himself on a boat for four weeks travelling to Hong Kong and then on to Japan before reaching South Korea.



For the following fourteen months Jim's home was a tent, with a floor for a bed, gradually upgrading to a camp bed. Jim was deployed to fix guns, machinery & vehicles. He was placed 8 miles back from the frontline and was not directly in the line of fire. He said there was a great camaraderie between the other nationals which were made up of predominantly Americans, Canadians, Australians, and British soldiers. He recalled how at first the British soldiers had very little and they saw how the Americans had good equipment and washing facilities. This prompted some ingenuity on the part of the British troops who would commandeer items beyond repair to repurpose into items such as workable ovens and showers.

Jim and Enid Pickering

An armistice occurred in 1953 and is still in place to this day - perhaps one of the reasons why this war is not widely discussed. Jim and Enid visited South Korea in 2014 and they recalled how Koreans everywhere kept thanking them for their involvement as if it had only recently happened. For Koreans, the threat of hostilities has never gone away.

I asked Jim if he got homesick and he said he longed for the 'green, green grass of England' - something he appreciates to this very day. Returning to the UK Jim went on to become a chartered mechanical engineer. He meet his wife, Enid, at a local dance when he was 25 years old and they married a year later; 67 years on their marriage is still going strong.

Jim said looking back he felt that his time in service made him the man he was to become; it broadened his horizons, gave him confidence in life and prepared him to take risks. Years later he and Enid spent two and a half years living in Saudi Arabia, something very few families in Warrington would consider even in the 80s. Once their children had grown up they continued their love of travelling visiting many countries but it was Thailand that captured their hearts and they returned every year for 15 years.

They moved to Epsom 23 years ago to be nearer to their family. These days they enjoy playing bridge and are members of several local groups including the U3A, Christ Church and Age Concern Epsom & Ewell's Men's Group. They enjoy eating out, especially Thai, and spending time with their family. Jim also enjoys watching his beloved Warrington Wolves (Rugby League) on TV. Thank you to Jim & Enid for sharing your story with us!

We operate a national website dedicated to the donating, buying and selling of new and used disability equipment for use by individuals, carers & organisations.


**Need equipment?** - You can search for items or post a wanted listing if you can't find what you need. ·Have equipment to sell or donate? - It's free to list items on the website.
