Shopping

Now, more than ever, online shopping is a huge benefit (apart from online supermarket deliveries which I have just about given up on).

Amazon are the world leaders and although they have questionable tax returns and work practices, they do a fantastic job of getting products quickly to the customer. So in this testing time we have used then a lot and they have not disappointed.

Things can go wrong - last month we had an email from the courier to say that an item we had ordered had been delivered but it definitely had not. The courier even said there was a photo proving delivery but when we looked all that was there was a map of the area. I could not make any headway with the courier because their phones are automated and all we could get was "your item has been delivered. Can we help with something else?" There was NO way to speak to a person. My mistake was to spend 2 hours trying to contact the courier. What I should have done is gone straight to the seller (a garden centre) who, after a couple of questions, sent me a replacement. I assume they got onto the courier and claimed compensation.

In my experience this sort of problem is highly unusual but it illustrates that sellers will generally bend over backwards to keep you happy. Unlike couriers!

Here are some tips from Moneyadviceservice about online shopping:

These are some really simple ways to shop safely online you can use every day:

- 1. Research retailers online to make sure they're legitimate.
- Make sure the website is secure.
- 3. Know your rights and the company's returns policy.
- 4. Keep software and virus protection up-to-date and use strong passwords for online accounts.
- 5. Don't use public Wi-Fi. Your standard data connection is more secure.
- 6. Pay using a credit card. You will have more protection. Alternatively, online services like PayPal mean scammers will not be able to get hold of your bank details.
- 7. Be smart. If a deal looks too good to be true, it probably is.

ITV's equivalent is ITV Hub. However it does have adverts. If you want to remove adverts and be able to download to your iPad then you have to pay £4.99 per month for ITV Hub **plus**.

However its best to start with the free version.

It is similar to the BBC iPlayer.

Home: Promoted tv shows. What is popular and recommended for you (influenced by your previous viewing). Scroll down for popular categories.

Live TV. Where you can watch any of the 6 live ITV channels on your iPad anywhere in your house or garden.

Categories: find a TV programme by one of the many categories.

Search: find a TV programme by name.



My TV. Where your last watched and downloaded programmes are.

Sudoku is an excellent game for exercising the brain cells and it works particularly well on an iPad or Tablet. There are many games in the App Store and Google Play. Some will have "in App Purchases" which usually

means you can play free but if you want to remove the pesky adverts or unlock more advanced games you have to pay. Remember you will always be asked if you want to pay and if you do not it is easy to cancel, delete the app from your iPad and try another one.



This one is called Sudoku - Classic Sudoku Games and is free, has no In App Purchases and is very straightforward. Worth a try if you like Sudoku.
